Long Island Problem Gambling Resource Center

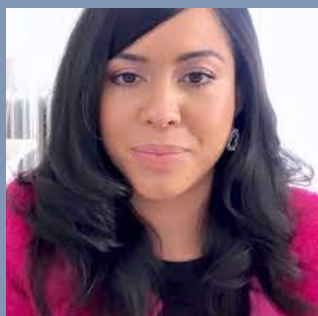
